#### **HOPE WINS!**

Jeff came from what he calls a "broken childhood." His father wasn't in his life and at the age of 18 years old, his mother was murdered and both grandparents died within months apart. At that point in life, he no longer had any family and was all alone.

Jeff's brokenness led him to become involved in gang activities and substance abuse. His poor choices resulted in him serving three separate prison incarcerations. Following his release in 2022, Jeff was homeless and went to stay at the City Rescue Mission shelter and enrolled in their program.

"I wanted help, and I wanted a 'normal life,'" Jeff shared.

Jeff reached out to Northcare for counseling. Northcare soon referred him to Upward Transitions to retrieve his birth certificate and identification documents so he could access housing, employment, and other social services. An Upward Transitions case manager collaborated with Jeff to obtain his birth certificate and ID.

Once Jeff obtained his ID from Upward Transitions, he told his parole officer he wanted to go to college. The parole officer told him about an education program called the Center for Social Innovation offered at OSU-OKC. After only a few days, Jeff submitted his application and was accepted into the program.

"My journey in education has been very healing for me. I've been able to excel in all of my studies and I'm going to be involved in leadership," Jeff explained. "I'm pursuing a degree in business."

Jeff soon received his certification in Microsoft Office and obtained an internship at Integris Health as a business analyst in data science. He soon graduated from the program at City Rescue Mission and was recognized at the Mission of Hope at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum for his accomplishments. Jeff's focus and commitment to his education resulted in his 12-year parole sentence being suspended, which rarely happens.

"This has been the most powerful year for me. Being able to overcome all my obstacles; being able to make good grades in college; being able to excel; and coming from the situation I was in - life is great and I feel alive again!" exclaimed Jeff.

Through the programs and services of Upward Transitions supported by United Way of Central Oklahoma and the collaboration of community partners such as the City Rescue Mission, Northcare, and others, Jeff will join the leadership team at OSU-OKC to help welcome and mentor new students into the Center of Social Innovation program.

Together, the non-profit community created a safety net to help a man overcome his past and transform into a self-sustainable and productive citizen. His desire to give back and help others who share his struggles completes that circle of hope and compassion we invested in as a community.
